Although I do not envy your position at this point I do think that this email is outside the norm of the type of emails that you have been receiving since April 22, 2010 when this nightmare began for your company and our nation.

This email is one of introduction to a potentially new way of a fossil fuel company doing business.

Our failure over the past several years to modernize our energy infrastructure, the network of transmission lines, gas pipelines and oil refineries that transports our energy to consumers and converts raw materials into useable fuels is the result of the lack of careful planning and lack of comprehensive national energy plan.

Today your company is dealing with one of 484 active oil rigs off the coast of the United States. My questions sir are as follows:

1. Are golf balls and tire parts really a scientific plan to stop this catastrophe?
2. How long do you think the mud process will work?
3. Why has BP not looked to the "Green" community to assist in the clean up efforts?
4. How much has your company estimated the cost of a gallon of Gasoline to go up now that you and your competitors have been told to cease all new exploration and all new permits to drill are on hold?
5. How much money are you privately spending to assist the poor people and businesses of the Gulf Coast in cleaning up their businesses and vessels?
6. How can a company that makes \$6.7 million per day have a total cap of damages exposure of only \$75 million?

The oil that is spewing out in the Gulf of the United States is like a torn artery of our nation

that will eventually cause the total collapse of the Louisiana fishing industry and another catastrophic psychological blow to the great people of that state that still haven't recovered from Katrina and Gustav.

I urge you and your company to not try to defend what is not working and find a solution. Set new protocols for the entire industry. Pay for the clean up! And listen to people in the environmental community that have great ideas and solutions to this most heinous crime on our environment.
