

## **Pennsylvania Green Legislation**

**HB 2** (Gerber) An Act providing for the sale of transportation fuels containing clean, renewable or alternative fuel content.

**HB 5** (M. Smith) An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, providing for the High-Performance Buildings Tax Credit.

**SB 4** (Browne) Amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971 to provide for limitation on research and development tax credits

**SB 6** (Erickson) Amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971 to authorize a solar energy tax credit

**SB 8** (Wozniak) An Act amending the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, further providing for exclusions from the sales and use tax.

**SB 12** (Williams) Amends the Administrative Code of 1929, further providing for the powers of the Pennsylvania Energy Development Authority.

**SB 13** (Williams) An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the definition of "public utility"; adding a definition of "micro-grid"; further providing for duties of electric distribution companies; and providing for micro-grids.

**SB 15** (Mellow) An Act providing for alternative energy infrastructure development; establishing the Alternative Energy Infrastructure Development Fund; and conferring powers and duties on the Department of Community and Economic Development.

**SB 16** (Mellow) Amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971, providing for a cellulosic ethanol research and development tax credit and for a cellulosic ethanol production tax credit.

**SB 17** (Mellow) Amends the Tax Reform Code of 1971, providing for an energy crop tax credit.

**SB 18** (Mellow) Amends the Administrative Code of 1929, providing for energy crop education; and making an appropriation.

**SB 22** (Tomlinson) Provides for the Alternative Fuels Incentive Fund

**SB 25** (Waugh) An Act amending the act of November 30, 2004 (P.L.1672, No.213), known as the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act, further defining "alternative energy sources" and "Tier II alternative energy source

**SB 26** (Wonderling) An Act amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, further providing for special power relating to State

**SB 31** (D. White) Amends the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act, further providing for definitions.

**SB 36** (M. White) An Act providing for the study and mandated content of biodiesel fuel.

**HB 43** (Dermody) An Act amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in restructuring of electric utility industry, further providing for duties of electric distribution companies

**HB 45** (DePasquale) Amends Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the procurement of fuel-efficient vehicles.

**SB 1** (M. White) Provides grants, loans and tax credits for alternative energy production and alternative fuels
